GRPB THE PENANG MODEL







- ✓ BEST Bus is a park-and-ride free shuttle bus service across the Penang Bridge between Seberang Perai and the Bayan Lepas FIZ.
- ✓ BEST Shuttle Bus services are implemented to reduce traffic congestion during peak hours across the Penang Bridge and to reduce the financial burden of workers having to commute across the bridge.
- ✓ 16 Rapid Penang buses are placed to run three different routes namely BEST A, BEST B and BEST C









- ✓ An initiative of the Penang Island City Council (MBPP), the "Pedestrian is King" campaign aspires to make the island a safe haven for pedestrians.




Inspiring Using Minds Towards STEM







- ✓ Changing of 6217 units of HPSV type street lights to LED lights within the City Council of Penang Island's area.


- ✓ The main objective of the proposal is to realise the state government's aspiration of reducing electricity cost, maintenance cost and encouraging green technology as well as involvement of companies in the LED products industry in green technology.
- ✓ The Council estimates a reduction in use of energy by 50% after 6217 lights are changed to LED lights.
- ✓ The first phase is expected to begin in October 2017 and all the 18,000 street lights are expected to be completely changed by the year 2020.
